Course Title	: Arab Library and Lexicography
Credit Hours	: 3

Course Number : 703118
Course Title : History of Islamic Civilization and Systems
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

The social, political and economic life prevalent before the mission of the Prophet, may God bless him and grant him peace, the emergence and spread of Islam, the foundations upon which Islamic civilization was built, and Islamic institutions such as the Caliphate, the Ministry, the Governors, the Diwans, the Judiciary and the His bah, the Post Office, the Police, the Classes, the Endowments, the Army, Islamic Sects, the Impact of Islamic Civilization on Contemporary Civilization, and the Western View of Islamic Civilization.

Course Number : 703112
Course Title : History of the Ancient East
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes the most important civilizations that appeared in the ancient Near East since the fourth millennium BC, especially the Egyptian civilization and the civilization of Mesopotamia, in addition to the study of civilizations that appeared in the Levant and focusing on the cultural aspects.

Course Number : 703113
Course Title : History of Greece and Romans
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes the study of the effects and history of the Greek and Roman Greeks and Romans and their civilization and their influence on the civilizations of the ancient Near East in general and the Levant region in particular, where they quoted from Syria the natural alphabet, which is considered the mother of the European alphabets, but the ABCs of the whole world, and the study starts from the civilization of the Aegean and Crete (seminal) (and Mycenaean) in Greece to the Hellenistic civilization for Greece and the civilization (Eristic), which preceded the Roman civilization, which quoted many of them, especially from the Greek metropolis Greece and includes the most important article. The historical and cultural achievements of Greece and the Romans and their impact on human civilization The material covers the time period extending from the beginning of classical times until the beginning of the Byzantine Period (approximately the fifth century AD).



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Course Number : 703114
Course Title : History of the Arabs before Islam
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes the study of the history of the Arabs before Islam from the first millennium BC until the advent of Islam and the statement of the civilized role played by the ancient Arab entities, whether in the southern Arabian Peninsula (Yemen) or in other regions of the Arabian Peninsula and show their interaction with contemporary civilizations and nations, in addition to the entities that emerged outside the borders of the Arabian Peninsula and will focus on the political, economic, social and religious conditions of the Arabs before the advent of Islam.

Course Number : 703141
Course Title : Introduction to the Study of History
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : 702111

The most important human achievements in prehistory and historical times and the most important driving factors of history, the benefits of history, its divisions, theories and doctrines, the philosophy of history and the most famous philosophers of history (such as Saint Augustine, Ibn Khaldun, Vico, Kant, Hegel, Marx, Toynbee and others).

Course Number : 703221
Course Title : History of the Prophet and Al Rashidun Period
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites :

The era of the message in the Meccan period and the Medinan period (the establishment of the state), the organizations of the Messenger, may God bless him and grant him peace, Islam and the opposition forces, the Rightly Guided Caliphs, the establishment of the Caliphate and its development, the conquest movement, the administrative system, the influential trends in the Rightly Guided era (the sedition, its causes and effects).

Course Number : 703222
Course Title : History of the Umayyad State Online 3
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : 703221

This course includes the study of the following vocabulary, the development of the institution of the caliphate, the continuation of the conquest movement, administrative development, social, economic, and urban life, opposition movements and the transfer of power to the Abbasid family.



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Course Number : 703224
Course Title : History of the Abbasid State (1)
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : 703222

This course includes identification of the Abbasid call movement and principles, then the Abbasids and their general trends Caliphate and the mandate of the Covenant and administrative developments and foreign relations Caliphate and the army and the introduction of the Turks and its impact on the state and the emergence of the Emirates and economic developments The emergence of trade The expansion of agriculture and monarchies and loss and social revolutions The Zanj revolution and the movement of the qarmatians and Ismaili.

Course Number : 703226
Course Title : History of the Islamic World from the 4th to the 7th Century AH
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

The rise of the buyid state and the emergence of the Seljuk state and its most important institutions, the conditions of the Abbasid Caliphate in the fifth and sixth centuries AH, its most important organizations and its position on division and foreign invasion, the rise of the atabeg states and their position on the Frankish invasion, especially the Al-Buri and Al-zangi dynasties, the rise of the ayyubid state and its most important institutions, the history of the Islamic East and the most important states that were established in it, especially the ghaznavid state, the ghurid state and the khwarazmian state.

Course Number : 703227
Course Title : The Spread of Islam in Asia and non-Arab Africa
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course examines the spread of Islam in Iran, Afghanistan, India, Central Asia, China and Southeast Asia, as well as the spread of Islam in Central and Southern Africa.



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Course Number : 703228
Course Title : History of the Abbasid State (2)
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : 703222

This course includes identifying the history of the Abbasid state during the time period (132-656 AH) and the stages of this historical period Buyid domination of the Abbasid Caliphate and then Seljuk domination and the establishment of the caliphate and its independence and the factors for achieving this and finally the Mongol invasion and the fall of the Abbasid state in Iraq and the clarification of the system of government and the powers of the caliphs at each stage and the relationship of the Abbasid state with independent Islamic countries and the nature of its relationship with the Abbasid Caliphate and its position on external dangers to Islamic countries at the time and to clarify the features of this period and developments And its results politically, administratively, economically, socially, scientifically and intellectually, and valuing the role of the Abbasid caliphs in achieving and preserving the independence of the caliphate, and their efforts in activating scientific and cultural life and tracking the factors of weakness in the Abbasid state and the reasons for its fall at the hands of the Mongols .

Course Number : 703243
Course Title : Historical Research Methods
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes identifying concepts related to (history of history) and the development of historical writing and its methods, then a theoretical study of the steps of the historical research method, including the steps of carrying out research in terms of identifying topics, making plans, seeing sources, studying, criticizing and analyzing novels, historical writing with documentation, in addition to focusing on practical training for each of these steps, developing the student's abilities to criticize, analyze, conclude and deduction, and provide him with the skills of organizing and formulating ideas and the best way to collect scientific material so that the student can From understanding its sources and narrations accurately.



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Course Number : 703321
Course Title : History of Morocco and Andalusia
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes identifying the social, political and economic structure at the conquest of both the Maghreb and Andalusia, which relates to the Period of the governors and the Period of the Emirate of Cordoba, with reference to the origins and developments of the population, especially in the countries of the Arab Maghreb when the separatist movements led to the establishment of independent states such as the Aghlabid state in the Near Maghreb, the two drawings in the Central Maghreb, and the Idrisids in the Far Maghreb, and its reflection on the conditions of Andalusia later, and the focus is on the march of Andalusian civilization after the establishment of security and stability.

Course Number : 703322
Course Title : History of the Mamluks
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes identifying the sources of studying the history of the Mamluks, the entry of the Mamluks in the service of the Ayyubid state, the main political and military developments in Egypt and the Levant during this period, the Mamluk administration in it, as well as the following institutions: The Sultanate - the feudal army - the cultural remnants of this period, especially in architecture and some other Islamic arts.

Course Number : 703323
Course Title : History of Jordan and Palestine in the Islamic Period
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

The course includes presenting a general framework for the region of Jordan and Palestine in the Islamic period of 922 AH within extended historical stages and the challenges faced by the region and clarifying the Arab-Islamic role in those challenges that continue with the Zionist occupation of Palestine.



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Course Number : 703331
Course Title : History of the Ottoman Empire
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : 703222

This course includes identifying the origin of the Ottomans, the emergence and expansion of the Ottoman Empire, its political history, administrative, financial, military and legal systems, as well as looking at the Ottoman society and the economic structure of the Ottoman Empire with a focus on the Arab world.

Course Number : 703336
Course Title : Jordan's Modern and Contemporary History
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes historical, economic, social and administrative developments in Jordan since the inception of the Emirate of Jordan, developments during the British Mandate Period, knowledge of developments after the declaration of ownership in 1946, Jordan's role in national issues during the reign of King Hussein, the Jordanian-Palestinian relationship, Jordan's role in the June 1967 war, in addition to the position on the Gulf War (90/1991), the return of democratic life in Jordan, and developments in all fields during the reign of King Abdullah II (1999-2023).

Course Number : 703337
Course Title : History of the Modern World
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes a general definition of the most prominent features of the modern Period from the political, economic, social and intellectual aspects by studying the Renaissance, geographical discoveries, religious reform, the French and American revolutions, and the unification of Italy and Germany.



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Course Number : 703338
Course Title : Issues of the Contemporary Islamic World
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes learning about the following topics: Borders, religious, ethnic and linguistic minorities, water scarcity and the expansion of desertification, loss of food security, unemployment and poverty nationalism, nationalism, religion, and the attraction between them and the search for legitimacy, the faltering of democracy and the absence of masters of the law, the resort of some to violence, illiteracy and lack of skills, foreign occupation of some Arab countries: Palestine - Iraq - refugees, the weakness of scientific research and the decline of the role of the Arabic language.

Course Number : 701350
Course Title : Modern History of the Arabs
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes a general definition of the political, economic and cultural conditions in the Arab region after the movement of geographical discoveries and at the end of the Mamluk state and tries to explain the reasons for the weakness of the Mamluk state and the circumstances that paved the way for the entry of the Ottomans into the Arab region in 1516 AD and examines the nature of the Ottoman rule of the Arab region and the organizations that I establish and the intellectual and literary movement and the development of knowledge and the growth of cities and their organizations as well as monitors the most important global events that ravaged the region, including the French campaign and its impact on the movement of awareness and then the establishment of the state of Muhammad Ali Pasha The article continues its examination of the Arab consciousness movement through the emergence of renewal and reform movements, and then the calls against tyranny and the establishment of Arab associations, intellectual currents and parties that led to the end of Ottoman rule in 1918.



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Course Number : 703430
Course Title : History of Contemporary Arab
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course aims to study the meaning and its relationship to the linguistic structure, where the student deals in particular with the nature of the meaning: denotation, connotation, and vocabulary meanings. It also examines the relationship between sentences and the relationship of words in the sentence in terms of grammar and semantics or meaning, and it aims to analyze the sentence from several aspects, such as the figurative or literal meaning and its applications.

Course Number : 703433
Course Title : History Of Modern Arabian Maghreb
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -

This course includes a study of the conditions of the Morocco at the end of the fifteenth century European invasion of the Moroccan coasts, Entry into the Ottoman seminary. The rule of blood money in Algeria and the rule of the beys in Tunisia The Muradia family, the Husseini family and the Karamanli family in Libya The Saadian family in Marrakesh (1500-1666) and the Alawite dynasty (166-1912) The French occupation of Algeria (1830), the Algerian national resistance (1830-1914), the French protectorate over Tunisia (1830-1914) and the French protectorate over Marrakesh in 1912.

Course Number : 703434
Course Title : Modern Reform Movements in the Arab World
Credit Hours : 3
Prerequisites : -
